- BioChar is a charcoal product created in a specific way
- Low temp burn in a specialized kiln that captures emissions before it goes into atmosphere
- Breaks down very slowly, so when buried in your garden for it's benefits, it is sequestered within the soil. So do not turn the soil. Just dig enough to plant seedlings or seeds
- The crystaline structure holds water and nutrients to help build soil health.
- BioCharNow in Berthoud sells to home gardeners very reasonably. It is beetle kill lumber they get from the Forest Service.
- Recommended rate is not more than 10% BioChar to soil.

My New Garden Philosophy

- Amend the soil well, then try not to disturb it! Contact with air and sunlight disturbs the soil's natural microbiome of helpful bacteria and fungi. Do not turn the dirt each season.
- Use BioChar as soil amendment— it holds water and fertilizer for slow release. (No more than 10% of the soil mix)
- No commercial fertilizer!! Use Compost!!!
 Heavy nitrogen encourages lots of leaf and green growth but with shallow root structure. The runoff is bad for
 the water supply. As seen by the algae bloom in the Gulf of Mexico where all of our nitrogen runoff from
 Midwestern farms ends up! Straight down the Mississippi River killing all sorts of marine life!

- Free yourself from the idea that weeds are bad and weed sparingly.
- Plant cover crops under taller plants to help hold water.
- Don't clean up too much in the fall. Cover the bed with garden debris for moisture and to promote bacteria and fungi and for homes for beneficial insects. If it is too unsightly for your HOA, chop it up along the lines of mulch.
- Try not to use peat in gardening. Peat bogs are among the best places on earth that carbon sequestration occurs. Let's not dig it up and ship it all over the world! The big bag that I have is the last one I will ever own. I am switching to Back to Earth Composted Cotton Burrs

Benefits of Clover Lawns

- More resistant to drought
- More resistant to dog spots
- Does not need mowing as often
- Blooms and feeds bees and other pollinators
